# County Launches 49th Summer Food Program

Rensselaer County has launched its 49th Summer Food Program to keep county kids fed in summer 2023. The summer tradition is now approaching a half-century in operation with this year's program launch on Monday, July 10th during an event at Sunnyside Daycare. The program has been a source of nutrition, support, and encouragement for kids for generations, with the number of meals served approaching 5.5 million.

The Rensselaer County Summer Food Program is a partnership between the county, the US Department of Agriculture, and the state Education Department, and helps ensure kids 18 and under have access to nutritious meals during the summer.

'The expansion is helpful because it means kids who need a meal from all areas can access the Summer Food program during a time when it may be especially needed," said Rensselaer County Youth Director Pierce Hoyt.

The county Summer Food program includes 17 sites across the county serving lunch and either breakfast or a snack. Sites include day camps, Boys and Girls clubs, churches, community centers, schools, and housing projects. The meals are offered over the course of 10 weeks, running

through the months of July and August.

Rensselaer County Legislature Chair Kelly Hoffman stated, "The County's summer food program is an important part of the summer camp experience for so many children. The campers at 17 locations

around Rensselaer County are provided over 100,000 nutritious summer meals and snacks each year. It is a program the Legislature is thrilled to support.'

The county anticipates serving over 120,000 meals as part of this year's Summer Food program.

## Letter to the Editor



# **Community Band History and Concerts**

The Hoosick Falls Community Band's 2023 season has begun. It was in 1873 that Mr. Moon of the Bennington Cornet Band turned over the reins to Henderson S. VanSurdam who continued the concerts in the park tradition until his retirement in 1938. Since that time, there have been many conductors of the band who rehearsed in the Armory band room on the third floor on Mondays, and played the concerts on Wednesdays. Fred Quackenbush was manager of the band in 1965 when Bill Gaillard became conductor and music director of this well known band. Looking to the future, Bill has shared the baton with Tim Stratton who will assume the role of director at some point in the

The present band stand was erected in 1977 by the late Charles Geier and Hugh Harrington, and has received care from Bill and his wife, and currently from the Village of Hoosick Falls Highway department who placed the plaques back on the bandstand and placed gravel around the skirting to catch water from the roof to stop mud splatter.

When Henderson E. VanSurdam removed his family name from the band in 1972, the name Hoosick Falls Community Band was adopted and continues to this day.

The 2023 concerts in Wood Park will be held Wednesdays through August 23rd, from 7:30 to 9 pm. Various groups offer hot dogs, lemonade, popcorn, and other favorites.

In the event of an all day rain, concerts are relocated to the skating rink on Griffin Avenue. The public is cordially invited to each concert of marches, pop tunes, and overtures. A chair or blanket should be brought for seating.

A State of Emergency and a Local Emergency Order for the Town of New Lebanon was issued last week due to emergency conditions produced by flooding that occurred in the vicinity of Main Street in the Town of New Lebanon sometime during the evening of June 28th or the early morning hours of June 29th. The flooding, which occurred when a large beaver dam broke in the Pittsfield State Forest, emptied tens of millions of gallons of water around Main St.

Town volunteers and members of surrounding communities came together to help their neighbors, including on July 1st, when a large group gathered to help neighbors

clean up the remaining debris in their yards.

Infrastructure is being put in place so that when the beavers rebuild the dam, which they have already begun doing, the water will have outlets to flow and won't build up again.

The Columbia County Department of Health (CCDOH) is encouraging residents whose wells may have been exposed to the flood waters to get their wells tested for potential Giardiasis contami-

#### **Dividing Up the Carrots**

Thursday, October 5, 1854: This morning I took my wife and went to the fair to Pittsfield. While there I bought three dresses patterns and paid one dollar and 75 cts, for our three daughters.

Thursday, Oct. 12: Today I and Thomas piled wood in the wood house. This morning at three o'clock John F. starts for Albany with his two horse wagon with his two sisters and cousin Lewis and wife and Mrs. Doxon and cousin Caroline Bennet. Towards night I and Thomas with my horse and wagon got 20 bushel carrots in the celler, which makes 45 bushels we had and John Merrils had 50 bushels of the 95 bushels that said Merrils had got dug.

Friday: I and Thomas cut weeds and burdock and gathered a few apples and I gathered some walnuts that John F. shook off. Today at two o'clock John F. returned from Albany. He paid one dollar and 12½ cts for two bushel coarse salt.

Monday: This afternoon I worked on the highway and John F. and Thomas worked all day with the ox team and scraper, and today Mary Green came and washed for us and fetched Geo P. washing.

Wednesday: Today John Merrils sold bushels and I paid her 25 cts.

Jabez Babcock 50 bushels carrots and we divided 8 heaps, he says had ten bushels in a heap. He took one heap that was divided to make out his 59 bushels. Today Geo P. had a Shaker come with jacks and raised his house up and Nore Merrils helped him. He paid the Shaker 5 dollars.

Friday: This morning John F. carried Sylvester Howard's jack home that Geo P. had to help raise up his house, paid 25 cts to Howard for the use.

Saturday: This evening Thomas's father came and reckoned with us and found that we owed him 47½ dollars for Thomas, five months work and we paid 7½ dollars and 40 dollars remains unpaid. I paid 5 dollars of it and John F. paid two dollars and 50 cts.

Sunday: Today James Bennet fetched my two daughters home from Albany with his wife and Doctor Dickerson wife, they stayed to said Bennet's last night.

Tuesday: I and my wife pulled turnips, and today noon Thomas Lindsay he worked out his five months and he quit this afternoon.

Wednesday: I and my wife cut and pulled turnips and Charlotte cut this afternoon and Louisa Merrils cut 20 bushels and I paid her 25 cts.
