McLaughlin Delivers State of the County Address

On Tuesday, March 12th, Rensselaer County Executive Steve McLaughlin delivered his annual State of the County (SOTC) address for 2024, in the legislative chambers at 99 Troy Road in East Greenbush. McLaughlin began by leading legislators in a moment of silence for Casey Frankoski, who was killed last week in a helicopter crash while patrolling the Texas-Mexico border with the National Guard.

The SOTC was the second delivered at county offices at 99 Troy Road, a centerpiece of the Reimagine Rensselaer County Facilities project initiated by McLaughlin with support from the Legisla-

ture to modernize county facilities. Along with the county offices, the project has included renovation of the County Office Building in downtown Troy, construction of a second DMV, development of a new senior center in Troy, and more.

The 37 percent property tax reduction over the past six budgets has helped to generate investment and growth in the county, with property value growing from \$14.3 billion in 2023 to \$15.8 billion in 2024.

The county is also seeing record performance in sales tax

and retail activity, and has earned a series of positive independent audits, record-high bond ratings, and unprecedented earnings for interest income.

In addition, American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds are being used for the extension of water and sewer infrastructure in Schodack, North Greenbush, and Poestenkill.

Along with infrastructure improvements, the county is also readying a project to update the Van Rensselaer Manor nursing home, which was opened over 25 years ago.




Progress continues with the Stephentown Community Solar Campaign. As of Monday, March 4th, we have at least 56 Stephentown residents who are now fully enrolled in the program. This means we are only 4 subscribers short of reaching our tier 2 goal of 60. We hope you will help us reach this goal very soon.

The first 10 subscribers qualified the Town of Stephentown for a NYSERDA tier 1 energy efficiency grant of \$5,000. This will be used for a professional Energy Audit of the Town Hall to identify the next steps needed. The next 50 subscribers, for a total of 60, will qualify the town for an additional \$10,000 in grant funds to begin to address these steps.

In addition to the 56 residents, the Town of Stephentown has signed up all 3 of its NYSEG accounts for Community Solar: the Town Hall, the Highway Garage, and the Transfer Station. Unfortunately, these municipal accounts do not count towards the tier 2 goal.

The Stephentown Clean Energy Committee has reached out to all those who initially indicated interest in subscribing but have not successfully finished the enrollment process. If just a few of these become subscribers, we will be over the top. The committee stands ready to help anyone needing assistance, or if there are questions that need to be answered.

The Campaign will continue until at least April 15th. To sign up, please go to powermarket.io/ stephentown.html. There is no cost to sign up and subscribers should see about a 10% reduction in their annual NYSEG electricity bill. Questions can be directed to the Committee at stephentowncec@gmail.com. It is also not unusual to find Mrs. Alderman and Mr. Wagar behind the wheel of a bus when they need to support their dedicated staff of drivers.

On most days you will find Mrs. Alderman troubleshooting runs, hiring and training staff, or communicating with drivers, students, and families. This includes planning with both the BCSD staff for extracurricular driving needs and the BNL Athletics Department to ensure all sports runs are covered.

Mrs. Alderman is also dedicated to starting Mountaineers' bus safety early. Each summer, with the support of her staff, she holds an orientation for the incoming pre-k and kindergarten students, helping to acclimate them to the bus.

Mr. Wagar works alongside his staff of mechanics, responsible for a fleet of 27 vehicles, ensuring that all receive their routine maintenance, any necessary repairs, and are ready for Department of Transportation inspections.

Mr. Wagar and his staff also give their time and expertise to help teach and demonstrate their trade to our oldest student Mountaineers. These students are considering their plans after BCSD and preparing to enter into the workforce or continue to pursue their education beyond high school. Having hands-on experience with Mr. Wagar and his team can be an invaluable part of mapping out their future plans.

This year, Mr. Wagar and his staff are hosting two Mountaineer seniors who are in the automotive program at Questar III. The students are two of many Mountaineers who have done their shadowing at the BCSD Transportation Department over the last several years. This is a highlight each year for Mr. Wagar and his staff.

The BCSD Administrators Association nominated Mrs. Alderman and Mr. Wagar this year. They will be honored at the CASDA Annual Awards and Friends of Education Celebration Dinner on April 25th at Century House in Latham.

Town Board Highlights

The March 13th meeting of the East Nassau Board of Trustees began after public hearings on the tentative 2024 budget and the village speed reduction on all 3.4 miles of village roads.

After the board approved the treasurer's report and meeting minutes, village attorney Catalano reported that the code enforcement officer is working on a situation on Durham Hollow Road and has developed a rough draft on the accessory structure issue update in the land use law. He plans to have a copy to share at the next meeting.

He reviewed the resolution of Local Law #2 of 2024, which will reduce the village speed limit to 25 mph. Catalano stated that New York State approved a law allowing municipalities lower than 30 mph limits. Mayor Root mentioned that this law was instituted because of the increased speeding problem throughout the village.

The Narrow Bridge signs for Tsatsawassa Lake Road have been received, and the 25 mph village speed limit signs are ready to be placed on all village roads. Doug Dobert has received two quotes for road work on Tsatsawassa Lake Road. At this point, the two quotes are between \$36,000 and \$40,000. The plan is to get one more quote since the job averages over \$35,000. Dobert hopes to present more information at the April meeting.

The volunteer who offered to paint the Bell Tower hopes the project will be completed this year since the weather was so challenging last year. Elections are all set for April 19th, and will run from noon to 9 pm at the Hoags Corners Volunteer Ambulance Building. The East Nassau Board of Trustees election is one of the few competitive races in the county. Mayor Root has contacted the County Bureau of Public Safety about plantings for the Brainard Radio Tower. The hope is to have some spring plantings.

The Climate Smart committee will be working on a heat emissions guide and members will be taking a Beyonds Plastics course in hopes of learning ways to reduce plastic

use in the village. They have asked to be placed on an upcoming agenda to describe their work.

The 2024-2025 budget was reviewed and adopted. It consists of a Village Tax Rate Per \$1,000 of \$1.84, which is an increase from the \$1.82 in the 2023-2024 budget.

The final item presented was a review of the Rensselaer County Hazard Mitigation Plan. Apparently, the plan must be reviewed every five years, and a planning group must be formed. The plan is the foundation of a community's long-term strategy to reduce disaster losses and break the cycle of disaster damage, reconstruction, and repetitive damage. FEMA grants are affected by this program, so it will be vital for the village to be a part of this planning group.

The organizational meeting has been planned for April 1st, at 6:30 pm, with the regular board meeting at 7 pm.





Isabel J. Krebs






"Mourning Cloak" Nature Photography by Trix Niernberger, Master Naturalist

On March 14th, I saw a male Mourning Cloak (Nymphalis antiopa) resting on an oak tree in the woods of Petersburgh. The Mourning Cloak is a large (up to four-inch wingspan) native butterfly that has a lifespan of 11 to 12 months, which is a long life for a butterfly. The adults hibernate during winter and are one of the first butterflies to surface in the spring when they begin their mating season. I didn't get a clear photo of that butterfly, but here is another male that visited in July. Enjoy Spring!
