Updates from the Petersburgh C8 (PFAS) Group

We have several positive items to report! After much urging from the Petersburgh C8 (PFAS) Group, and under order from the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), Taconic Plastics recently completed the removal of 2,400 yards of PFAS-contaminated soil from behind one of their buildings. For years, PFAS chemicals were taken up by rainwater running down the hill behind this building and carried into the Little Hoosic River where they continue to pose risks to the health of people, fish, and other animals. The DEC will monitor the run-off to be sure that at least this source of PFAS contamination is controlled.

The DEC has been very responsive to our requests to monitor the quality of the air in Petersburgh. Many people smell foul odors emanating from the Taconic Plant. The more we report what we smell, the more they can help us. You can join the effort to ensure we breathe clean air by reporting bad odors using this form: truthintegritychronicle.org/ptrsbrg8

Are you wondering why you haven't received the results of your blood tests from last spring? There has been a backlog but here is help: Call Steve Forand (NYSDOH Center for Environmental Health) at 518-402-7783.

The Petersburgh C8 (PFAS) Group continues to advocate for the health of our community. We are currently encouraging further investigation into the presence of PFAS chemicals in our fruit and vegetable gardens, deer, and livestock. Initial testing has been done but more is needed. Everyone is welcome to join us at our monthly meetings, held at the Petersburgh Public Library at 5 pm on the first Thursday of each month.





Barn Fire

With Extension to a House, Cars, and the Woods

On November 12th, the Rensselaer **County Emergency Communication** Center received multiple calls for a reported structure fire on Route 43 in Stephentown. The fire chief for the Stephentown Fire Department quickly arrived on scene and transmitted the working structure fire dispatch bringing the following fire departments to the scene: Hoags Corners, Taborton, Averill Park, and Stephentown Ambulance.

The chief found a large barn near the home along with multiple vehicles on fire. Upon further inspection, there was also a fire that had started down past the home from the embers from the barn. Firefighters arrived on scene and quickly stopped the fire from spreading to any other vehicles on scene and

knocked down the fire in the home. A fire chief grabbed a water can and made his way down the roadway and knocked down the fire in the woods before it could spread to the mountainside due to

the high winds. Firefighters worked extensively to bring the fire under control.

No injuries were reported and the fire is under investigation at this time.


Troy Turkey Trot

Northern Turnpike Talk

Historian Ken Gottry will give a talk on the story of the Turnpike Era (1797–1845) and the Northern Turnpike in particular at 7:30 pm on *November 21st* at the Pittstown Town Hall in Tomhannock. The title of the talk is "Northern Turnpike — From a Political, Social, and Economic Perspective." The Northern Turnpike ran from Lansingburgh to Granville, passing through Pittstown. The construction of turnpikes had significant impacts on local communities. Gottry will tell of the issues that arose involving big business, big government, influential lobbyists, voting irregularities, outsourcing, corrupt public officials, and much more. Gottry, who lives in Cambridge (and was raised there), has published several books and articles on local history. He also has lectured extensively and maintains a website of historic photos of Cambridge and the vicinity.

UAlbany Welcomes New Students for Fall 2024
